- 3. Next Step Topics The topic selected for the June 19<sup>th</sup> session was finishing techniques. Other future topics include:

  - e. Weaving structures (twill, overshot, etc.)
  - f. Weaving tartans
  - g. Tricks of the trade
- 4. The program for the 4<sup>th</sup> grade visit on May 31 went very well. We agreed to try to learn the identity of the girl who has a loom and already knows how to weave. We had children weaving on 5 looms, and also a bit of spinning with Q-tips and cotton balls.

- 6. Tom agreed to get contact information for the man who has been teaching quilting to inmates in the Richmond juvenile detention center. We would like to explore the possibility of having him give a public discussion of his experiences.
