July Minutes - Tom moved / Kathleen seconded and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Reports

Treasurer - Mary Ann reported July shop sales of \$769.00 and other income for total to the guild of \$1,040.14. Outgoing funds were \$115.07. More information can be found in the treasurer's book in the Yellow Cat Studio.

Foundation – Outdoor speaker system has been purchased and will be installed soon. Sept. 30 the Tavern will host a fundraising BBQ for \$35 a ticket from 3:00PM -6:00PM. You can order tickets online. The Tavern store sales are 10% above our best year so far this year. The blacksmiths need new members.

Studio/Yarn Status – Kathleen will be visiting MoPurl in late September, so give Jan your thread order, or anything you want for the studio, soon. Some members think we may want to start weaving our towels at 24EPI instead of 20, and using 12dent reeds instead of 10. It really just depends on the weave structure. When weaving in the studio, once a set of towels has been completed, be sure to wind leftover thread off the bobbins you used back onto the cone. Put a large knot so if someone else uses that color, they will notice the knot and take action needed. Don't attach the bobbin onto the cone when putting cone back into the studio supply room. Always clean up leftover cones and bobbins when a project is completed.

Linen Bread Bags- Our guild discussed making these out of linen due to its antimicrobial properties.

Linen will help keep bread fresh longer and only has shrinkage of about 10%. We want to make the

bags so they will be 14X18 finished. There is a lot of excess linen yarn in the yarn room; Luna would

be a good loom to put these on.

Lessons Learned - Hemp shrinks by 30% when washed. Watch for rust spots on MoPurl yarns. The

old magazines in the storage room and very enjoyable to look at, provide learning tips and patterns.

Feel free to take them home and have a look.

Teaching Moment - Working with Linen – Jan provided a handout for everyone to learn about linen.

High points — watch tension and try to minimize abrasion when using linen.
