## Reports

**Treasurer –** Anita advised we had \$199.75 in sales in March along with donations, dues and interest. Our outgoing funds of \$34.99 were for Handweaving.net. Our sales for April were \$488.13, plus interest, towel kit sale and weaving class fees. Outgoing April funds were to pay the weaving class instructors. **Foundation –** Becky advised a new foundation director has been hired along with an assistant since Corinne is retiring. There will be a retirement party for Corinne on Jul. 24 at 6:00PM. There is a fall class coming soon related to raising mushrooms. A new woodworkers building will be built soon and there are fundraising tickets being sold. They need \$350,000.00 for this new building. The foundation will soon start replacing all the heat pumps starting with those that have no crossover support if they were to fail. The foundation will be selling or donating the horse carriages.

**Studio/Yarn Status/Sales –** Jan advised we need more warps and that our yarn supplies are in good shape. Loom Bill has a warp on that is for a commission piece so please do not weave on Bill for now.

**MAFA/Other Guilds –** Laurie sent an email with all the MAFA conference details..Jun.26-29. The vendors for the MAFA conference look good this year. There is a zoom MAFA meeting on Jul.15.
